#### MICRO PRACTICE

- Boots on the ground
- Case work:
  - Meeting with clients
  - Connecting them to appropriate social service agencies
- Direct service at social service agencies
- Counseling (LICSW)

#### MACRO PRACTICE

- Policymaking
- Working administratively in government agencies
- Directing nonprofits
- Helping people by guiding how systems work

- Training on self-care, boundary setting, mental health, homelessness

## Librarians Provide

#### **ACCESS TO CLIENTS**

- Libraries are the initial point of access for people from all walks of life
- Urban libraries in particular are gathering places for people most in need of social services

#### INFORMATION NAVIGATION

- Social workers may build their information networks through relationships, rather than organized searching
- Social workers may not be trained on information literacy

# Whole Person Librarianship

Librarians aren't social workers.

#### **BUSINESS/CUSTOMER SERVICE**

- Measurement based on profit
- Transactions
- Prioritizes the loudest voices

## WHOLE PERSON LIBRARIANSHIP

- Measurement based on social science methodology
- Interactions
- Prioritizes the experience of each individual
